- one of the world's largest providers of business process services in a trial in the SDNY relating to contractual claims asserted by a colocation facility, winning a trial verdict dismissing all claims, and successfully defending the district court's decision in the Second Circuit;
- a law firm at trial, successfully defending a former partner's breach of contract claims;
- a nationwide honey manufacturer against deceptive marketing claims;
- a pharmaceutical company's breach of contract claims against an advertiser;
- a Government Agency in a trial in the EDNY relating to claims that its police force used excessive force in an arrest;
- a property owner, whose property had been physically damaged when a plane failed to take-off at an airport due to an unscrupulous plan to falsify records and overfill its gas tank;
- a Governmental Agency who was facing allegations under the Fair Labor Standards Act, Title VII, Federal Whistleblower Act, and related state-based human rights laws, successfully obtained a dismissal on Summary Judgment.

Ben is recognized for his strategic ability to successfully and aggressively resolve disputes, in an efficient and cost-conscious manner. He has a track record of developing and implementing creative solutions to complex legal problems.

Prior to joining DHC, Ben spent six years as an attorney for Hinshaw & Culbertson, LLP, where he
